### Warwick

Town rebuilt in brick and stone after 1694 fire; buildings for Warwick School; 1894 Arts-and-Crafts-inspired school building; 1890s coffee tavern with terracotta ornament; early gas retort house; 1850s buildings of Staffordshire blue bricks including former prison governor's house. Surviving workhouse, now hospital.  
Non-brick includes post-1694 rebuilding of the parish church with spectacular fifteenth-century chapel; town walls; two gates, one with chapel, one with almshouse.

### *Joining Instructions*

We shall assemble at 11.00 am outside the car showroom on Bowling Green Lane adjacent to Warwick Bus Station and opposite the Linen Street Car Park.

To access the Linen Street Car Park, leave the M40 at junction 15, interchange with A46 from Coventry and Nottingham and from Cheltenham and South Wales. Take the A429 for Warwick and proceed to Warwick's West Gate. Turn left into Bowling Green Lane and then take the left-hand turn into Linen Street and then first left into the entry to the brick-faced, multi-storey car park. This is signposted. The car park is narrow for very wide cars.

The town station in Warwick has trains from Birmingham Moor Street, Birmingham Snow Hill, High Wycombe and London Marylebone. Some trains from London only stop at Warwick Parkway (north of the town) and do not stop at the town station. Buses to the bus station are available on Coventry Road.
